ABOUT THE JOURNAL

The Journal of Law and Public Policy is an open access journal with a double-blind peer review process that publishes original scholarship on the interface between law and public policy at the national, regional, and international levels. Contributions that examine the process of public interest decision making are especially welcomed. Articles must advance interdisciplinarity in the field of law and justice with a strong focus on socio-economic and political contexts. In addition to academic quality, the journal encourages writing that is accessible to a wide range of readers such as policymakers, researchers, faculty, and students of law and public policy across the world. We welcome empirical, historical, and comparative analyses that are grounded in theoretical debates.

Founded in 2014, the *Journal of Law and Public Policy* is published twice a year by the National Law School of India University, Bengaluru. This includes one general issue and one theme-based issue.

JLPP seeks to expand and diversify its database of reviewers in line with its revised mandate. The editorial board seeks scholars, researchers, and practitioners with relevant knowledge in the field of law and public policy to review manuscripts.

We invite expressions of interest from both senior and early career colleagues to participate in this process. We may request you to undertake reviews of manuscripts

that match your area of expertise. We take care to make a reasonable number of review requests in a year, and reviewers always have the option to decline an invitation to review.

REVIEW PROCESS

- JLPP follows a rigorous double-blind peer review process, which prioritises constructive and timely feedback. This review process is integral to upholding the quality of the journal.
- Typically, we request you to review manuscripts within 20–28 days.
- We look for substantive comments in the following areas
 - o Originality and clarity of argument
 - Well-defined scope
 - Significance of the subject studied and its usefulness to the journal's readers
 - Appropriateness of methodology
 - Thoughtful engagement with relevant research in the field
 - Analytical rigour
 - Clarity of writing and soundness of the paper's organisation.
